Who We Support!

We try to recycle or re-donate what we cannot sell at the Thrift Shop. Eye glasses, batteries, cell phones, textiles, electronics, books and metals are either ethically recycled or re-donated.

We also quietly pass on donations that we either cannot sell, would go into recycling or worse into the garbage.

Cindy one of our Friday morning cashiers also volunteers with The Red Cross. We pass on medical equipment such as walkers, bath stools, crutches and other medical related donations and Cindy takes them to the Red Cross.

Karen and Elton collect old sheets that are turned into bandages by volunteers and then sent to a clinic in Africa.



We are mindful that clothing recyclables generate revenue to the Auxiliary. However, in some cases individual volunteers may store out of season items that we would recycle to be passed onto homeless outreach recipients once the season comes around (warm coats). Some brands of clothing that we do not sell but are still usable are passed on to a women's shelter.

Old towels are taken to a Cat Rescue.

This is by no means an exhaustive list as many ad hoc items are sent on their way to give them a second life and to support our neighbours and the community.

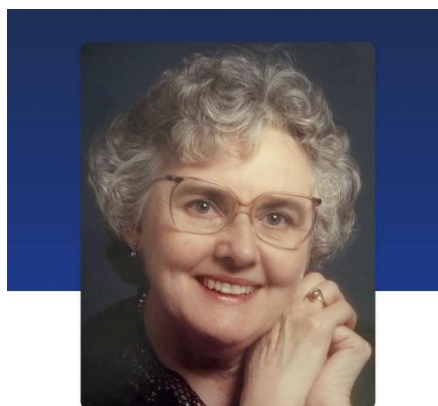
